

Announcement of ISRCAP Travel Awards for post-doctoral or junior faculty from underrepresented minorities

The International Society for Research in Child and Adolescent Psychopathology (ISRCAP) announces the availability of travel awards to postdoctoral fellows, instructors or assistant professors from underrepresented minorities with a Ph.D. or M.D. in psychology, psychiatry or a related field to attend the ISRCAP Biennial Meeting June 15-18, 2011 in Chicago, IL. Funded by the National Institutes on Drug Abuse (NIDA), Child Health and Development (NICHD) and Mental Health (NIMH) and the Office of Behavioral and Social Sciences Research (OBSSR) three travel awards (\$1000 each) will be awarded and the award recipient's registration fee for the conference will be waived.

ISRCAP was established in 1989 with the purpose of convening researchers in developmental psychopathology for biennial, highly focused meetings during which recent data on the causes, and course and prevention of mental disorders in children and adolescents are presented and discussed. Since its founding in 1989, ISRCAP has significantly expanded its membership in terms of numbers and representation.
